## **“NORMANBY HALL”**

Near Scunthorpe, this is a classical Regency mansion in 350 acres of unspoiled parkland. It was built in 1825-30 for Sir Robert Sheffield by Robert Smirke, the British Museum’s architect. The Sheffield family came to Normanby in 1539 and the first house on the site was replaced by a new building in the 17th century. The family lived elsewhere for most of the 18th century and the 17th century house was neglected. Smirke’s house built to replace this was a far more imposing building. The house and grounds are now owned by North Lincolnshire CC and the interiors have been carefully restored to their original character. The estate is now a Country Park. On the day of our visit there will be a special event at the Hall celebrating 100 years of Scunthorpe’s Hornsby Buses.
